

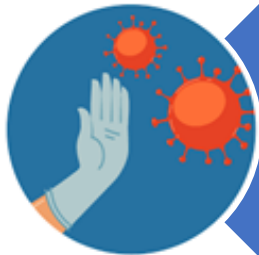
HPV VACCINE



Who Should Get HPV Vaccine? Recommended ages 11–12 years

All preteens need HPV vaccination, so they are protected from HPV infections that can cause cancer later in life

Teens and young adults through age 26 years who didn't start or finish the HPV vaccine series also need HPV vaccination



How Well Do These Vaccines Work? HPV vaccination works extremely well

HPV vaccine has the potential to prevent more than 90% of HPV-attributable cancers

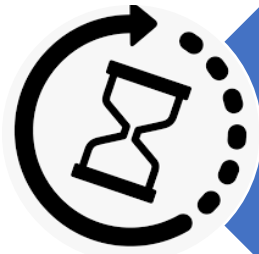
Fewer teens and young adults are getting genital warts

The number of cases of precancers of the cervix in young women is reduced



Where Can I Find These Vaccines?

HPV vaccine may be available at doctor offices, community health clinics, school-based health centers, and health departments



Long-lasting protection

People who received HPV vaccines were followed for at least about 12 years, and their protection against HPV has remained high with no evidence of decreasing over time
